<b>1</b>	<b>What are omnivores?</b>
Ans.	Some animals that eat both plants and flesh of animals are called omnivores. For example: bear, crow, pig etc.
<b>2.</b>	<b>What do you mean by scavengers?</b>
Ans.	Some animals that eat dead and decaying animals are called scavengers. For example, vulture, hyenas and jackals etc.
<b>3.</b>	<b>What does a cow do with its tail?</b>
Ans.	Cow uses its tail to fly away insects that sit on it.
<b>4.</b>	<b>What do you mean by carnivores?</b>
Ans.	Some animals that eat the flesh of other animals are called carnivores. For example lion, tiger, frogs, dogs etc.
<b>5</b>	<b>What do you mean by herbivores?</b>
Ans.	The animals that eat only plants are called herbivores. Example: Elephants, cow, zebra, dear etc.
<b>6.</b>	<b>Why do animals move from one place to another?</b>
Ans.	Animals move from one place to another in search of food and shelter and also to escape from enemies.

Ans.	Birds have a beak, tail, head, breast, two wings and legs.
